



## Northeast Florida Forever: Wildlands Currently Identified for State Conservation Acquisition Summer 2007

[Florida Forever](#) is the State of Florida's conservation land buying program, which to-date has protected more than half a million acres of Florida's most important natural areas. However, much land remains to be protected.

These properties are prioritized into A and B lists; **properties on the priority lists for acquisition *which occur in Northeast Florida* are listed below.**
